

TENURE TRACK FACULTY POSITON ANNOUNCEMENT LABOR RELATIONS

The labor Relations Institute (LRI), at the College of Social Sciences, University of Puerto Rico (UPR), Río Piedras Campus, is searching for scholars to fill a full time, tenure track Assistant Professor faculty position in the area of Labor Relations, to begin in January 2017.

Requirements: Ph.D. degree in Labor Relations. It will consider also candidates from related areas with a Ph.D. in Labor Studies, Labor Sociology and Labor Economics. All degrees must have been earned from a recognized and an accredited university. Applicants must have completed research. Candidates must have evidence of professional experience in at least two of the following areas: Collective Bargaining, Mediation, Conciliation and Arbitration, Organization and Management of Labor Unions and/or Employer-employee conflicts. They must have conducted research and published articles in professional peer review journals. Must have teaching experience at the university level, and demonstrate excellence in teaching. Must provide evidence of ability to work in an interdisciplinary and collaborative context. Must be able to incorporate educational technologies and students assessment techniques in the courses to be taught. Must be proficient in Spanish and English. Those candidates who qualify for the positon will be required to give an academic lecture and to be available for interview.

<u>Responsibilities:</u> Candidates must teach courses at the undergraduate program and at the Labor Education program of the LRI, during the day, evening and Saturday schedule. Must be available to supervise professional practices. Conduct research and have peer review publications in his/her areas of expertise; develop and submit proposals for external funding; contribute to departmental projects, as well as those at the College of Social Sciences and the Río Piedras Campus. Must fulfill all other obligations of a teaching position at the UPR. The responsibilities of the prospective candidate are included in the bylaws of the University of Puerto Rico.

The deadline for receiving documents will be September 30, 2016. Candidates must send: 1) a cover letter describing his/her academic philosophy, research vision and publication experience; 2) a curriculum vitae; 3) a copy of the academic credentials of all degrees he/she have earned; 4) evidence of research, publications and creative work; 5) three letters of recommendation to:
