The Graduate School of Planning, Río Piedras Campus at the University of Puerto Rico, announces the search for candidates for a tenure-track teaching position, effective August 1, 2024

### Job Requirements

- 1. Doctoral Degree in Planning or related areas, from an accredited institution
- 2. Area of Specialization: Physical-Spatial Analysis applied to urban planning, environment, social area and economics
- 3. Have proficiency in at least three (3) of the following areas: public policy and land use regulation; methods of geographical analysis for planning; scenario analysis; spatial analysis applied to climate change, disasters, population or others; collection, storage and processing of social, economic and geographic data using up-todate technologies; integration of artificial intelligence (AI) solutions into geographic information system (GIS) platforms and planning workflows
- 4. Demonstrate proficiency in using AI techniques such as machine learning and deep learning to analyze complex data sets and extract valuable insights relevant to planning activities
- 5. Exhibit ability to offer courses related to research methods; Spatial Analysis and Planning Projects
- 6. Experience teaching at the university, preferably at the graduate level, face-to-face and distance modes
- 7. Experience in research and having publications in his or her area of expertise in recognized peer-reviewed journals
- 8. Availability to teach or guide capstone projects
- 9. Experience and commitment to preparing proposals and obtaining external funds

# Responsibilities

- 1. Teach core courses in Planning at the graduate level during the day, evening, and Saturdays, as well as other courses in areas of emphasis and electives, both face-to-face and distance learning modes
- 2. Keep up with advances in AI and GIS technologies, and identify opportunities to improve planning processes through innovative approaches
- 3. Collaborate in the creation of a learning community around AI and spatial analysis among the School's faculty
- 4. Supervise professional practice and offer Planning Practice (*Practicum*) capstone course
- 5. Train and supervise students to offer academic services in the EGP Computer Lab
- 6. Lead the technological development of the School
- 7. Mentor students, depending on the needs of the Program
- 8. Participate in institutional committees as requested
- 9. Develop proposals for seeking external funding
- 10. Conduct research that produces at least four publications in the area of his or her specialty, two peer-reviewed publications, and two non-peer-reviewed reports or essays in the first five years of appointment
- 11. Participate in the publication of the School's digital magazine
